**1. Review plans for remediation of collapsed mine shaft near the intersection of Cleveland Street and Adams Avenue**

Eric Fallstrom, Benchmark Engineering, gave an overview of the proposed remediation of the collapsed mine shaft near the intersection of Cleveland Street and Adams Avenue.

The plan is to create an underground hatch in the area where the City could monitor and add more fill as needed. The slab would be designed to hold together and act as a bridge as the area continues to settle. The City received a grant around \$41,000 from the IRRB.

**2. 2011 Budget and Levy**

The Council will hold a workshop meeting on August 24, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. to discuss the 2011 budget and levy. The levy amount is due on September 15<sup>th</sup>.

**3. Funding Grant Avenue/Park Avenue Reconstruction**

The Council talked about transforming the lot (in the 200 Block of Grant Avenue) into a bike and snowmobile parking area. The idea of paving half of the parking lot and leaving grass on the other half was discussed. The Council will eliminate the curb cut to the lot as previously planned. The Council would also like to have further discussion on the possibility of removing the arch downtown.

**4. Discuss process for calling for quotes and bids**

**5. Agenda Q & A**

Bob and Kenne Cherro, Eveleth Veterans Park Campground Managers, addressed the Council about a possible complaint. Over the weekend a family reunion was held at the park. The family rented the entire campground along with the Pavilion. There were over 200 people in attendance. Representatives of the family made complaints regarding the condition of the restroom facilities. Bob Cherro said the restrooms were cleaned several times during the day. Director Wiskow said the City no longer requires parties to provide additional satellite restrooms at their events. The indoor restroom building is not

designed to adequately accommodate that large of a group. The City may need to provide additional satellites for future groups hosting large events.
