An Important Reminder that Illegal Dumping is a Crime



The Police and Public Works Departments are concerned with an apparent increase in the amount of unregulated and/or illegal dumping which has been reported and/or noticed within the City this summer. Not only is the unregulated and illegal disposal of materials unsightly, detracts from the overall appearance of the community, and increases the level of blight and blighted properties, but these conditions also harbor and promote unsafe, unsanitary, and potentially hazardous conditions which may present a significant public health hazard.

Sections 10.01, 10.21, and 10.22 of the Eveleth City Code regulates the storage and disposal of refuse, and the general condition of property to prevent potentially hazardous conditions.

Noncompliance with these provisions is not only detrimental to the community and its residents, but may also result in enforcement actions. Please be reminded that these provisions exist for the common good and welfare of the entire community.

THE POLICE AND PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENTS will be closely monitoring these behaviors, and look forward to increased compliance and a marked decrease in this activity - ultimately leading to a more attractive and healthy community!

Defensive Driving Refresher Course to be Offered August 16

Minnesota Statutes 65B.28 requires insurers to provide a premium reduction of at least 10% for a 3 year period to drivers 55+ certified to have received this training.

The (required) initial 8-hour course certification is effective for 3 years, as are the 4-hour refresher courses.

A refresher course will be held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the United in Christ Lutheran Church on Highway 53. Retired Mn state trooper Mike Flatley will be the instructor and the cost is \$12.00. **The Eveleth Police department supports this program and recommends all eligible drivers take advantage of this opportunity.**

Almost 400 fire hydrants are in service around the city; it is **VITALLY IMPORTANT** that access to these devices is available **AT ALL TIMES** for emergency responders and equipment.

The Fire Department invites ALL residents to consider adopting a hydrant during the winter to ensure continued and unimpeded access by removing snow and debris to provide a minimum of 3 feet of access in all directions.

RECYCLING REMINDER

Responsible solid waste management includes minimizing the generation of waste, of which recycling is a MAJOR component.
