## Police Matters School has Started—Be Alert!

The Eveleth Police Department provides you the following information promoting community safety and to help prevent accidents and injury to students and all:

- **School Hours** - Franklin Elementary 8:10 a.m.-2:50 p.m.; Senior High School 8:15 a.m.-2:54 p.m. **PLEASE remember** extra-curricular activities are scheduled **ALMOST EVERY DAY**.
- **Bus Routes** - In addition to the one in-city route, buses usually enter/leave the city and schools via Elba Ave., Fayal Ave., McKinley Ave., and Fayal Road. **Stay alert for school buses!**
- **School-Zone Speed Limits** are in effect whenever children are present, going to or leaving school, and during recess. School-zone speed limits are set at 20 mph and violations are double the usual fine amounts, as per Minn. Stat. §169.14, subd. 5a(a).
- **General Traffic Safety** - Children and students normally have other things on their mind than paying keen attention to traffic conditions; **HELP OUR STUDENTS** by watching out for them.

## Halloween Safety Tips



- S** Swords, knives, and similar costume accessories should be short, soft, and flexible.  
**A** Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.  
**F** Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.  
**E** Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.



- H** Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you.  
**A** Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent skin and eye irritation.  
**L** Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.  
**L** Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.  
**O** Only walk on sidewalks or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.  
**W** Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.  
**E** Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats unless you know the cook well.  
**N** Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Otherwise, stay outside.  
**N** Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

### Rekindles Eveleth Dining; Now Open



The early and mid 1970s was a period of bustle and growth on the Range, and from then through the next several decades many, many residents, guests and visitors stopped in or frequented the 5,400 square foot building located adjacent to Highway 53 in Eveleth for dining, socializing, and festive entertainment. Originally the establishment was furnished and decorated as a historical shrine to Eveleth hockey.

Paying tribute to Eveleth and the Iron Range is once again on the menu at 501 Hat Trick Avenue. The City of Eveleth enthusiastically welcomes BoomTown Woodfire, and owners Erik and Jessica Lietz, as the latest addition to its business community. Erik and Jessica are also the proprietors of the Whistling Bird on Broadway Avenue in Gilbert. BoomTown Woodfire is billed as "A new restaurant with a spin on traditional American faire", and features a hardwood-fueled rotisserie serving up inspired eats, along with eclectic wines and hand-crafted cocktails.

The fully renovated facility pays homage to its local roots, with the upscale rustic décor punctuated with a full-length feature wall mural of Eveleth's main street some 100 years ago. The mural was commissioned to and created by Mike Pariseau, whose previous work adorns Sue's Penalty Box on Grant Avenue in Eveleth with a feature mural of the 1980 USA Olympic Hockey victory over the (then) USSR.

Renovation of the facility was accomplished in part through assistance from the Eveleth Economic Development Authority.

Now fully operational and open daily at 11 a.m., BoomTown Woodfire offers lunch, dinner, and everything in between!
