**4. Discuss easement for Trail Hawks Snowmobile Club**

Public Works Director Rosati said the Trail Hawks Snowmobile Club has requested an easement for the trail across City property East of Highway 53. Attorney Colosimo suggested a license be issued rather than an easement. There would be some liability issues

to determine, and the City would likely be exempt due to recreational use under the tort claims act.
